Dear Parent/Guardian,

The district was contacted yesterday by Pasadena Police regarding an incident that took place in the Deepwater area on Tuesday afternoon. As a boy and a girl were walking home from school, a man in a car reportedly drove up to them and began a conversation with the girl. As she spoke to the man, he exposed himself to her. According to the girl, she walked away from the vehicle, and the man drove away. She described the man as a Hispanic male in his 30s who spoke English and Spanish and drove a red car.

This incident is currently under investigation by Pasadena Police. School district employees are reviewing appropriate safety precautions with students, and I encourage you to do the same at home. Our psychological services director offers the following suggestions if your child is approached by a potentially dangerous person:

- Run away;
- Say "no" loudly, make a lot of noise and draw attention to herself/himself;
- Find a safe person;
- Tell an adult as soon as possible.

Police also advise that children should never share any personal information such as their name, school, or address with a stranger in a situation such as the one described in this letter.

Student safety is our highest priority. We continue to work closely with police to ensure the safety of students before, during and after the school day.
