Objective:

Students will use problem solving, language and communication, connections within and outside mathematics, and reasoning. Students will be able to use multiple representations, applications and modeling, justification and proof, and computation in problem-solving contexts. (TEKS)

Assignments:

- **HOMEWORK** - All work that is not finished in class is homework. It will always be due at the beginning of the next class period. According to department policy, no late work will be accepted unless there are extenuating circumstances.
- **PENCIL ONLY** - All assignments must be completed in PENCIL. Assignments written in pen will not be accepted.
- **SHOW YOUR WORK** - You **MUST** show your work to receive full credit. Points will be deducted if you do not show your work - even if you get the right answer.
- **EXTRA CREDIT** – Extra credit assignments are never given individually. However, extra credit assignments may be given to the entire class.
- **MAKE-UP WORK** – If you are absent, it is your responsibility to ask for any assignments that you have missed. Depending on the length of your absence, you will have up to 5 days to complete the missed assignments. All assignments given before the absence are due upon the students return to school. All missed quizzes and tests must be scheduled with the teacher and are usually taken before or after school.
- **RETESTING** – If a student scores below 70 on a test, he or she may be allowed to take a retest to improve the score. However, no student will be allowed to retest more than two major exams within a six weeks grading period. The maximum score of a retest is 70. The student must correct the first test and gain the teacher's permission before a retest can be scheduled.
